The Book of Concord, first compiled in 1580, brought together foundational Lutheran confessional documents, including creeds, catechisms, and doctrinal statements formulated after the Reformation. Its development was shaped both by theological debates and the need for unity among reforming churches. Today, the Book of Concord continues to serve as a guide and reference for

doctrine, worship, and church governance, underscoring its enduring relevance across centuries and communities.

LUTHERAN WITNESS: The June/July Lutheran Witness, titled, "You Are All One" takes up the topics of unity and variety in the LCMS worship services. With ever pressing divisions within the LCMS on unity in worship styles, Revelations 7:10 reminds us that the day will come when all believers from all tribes and nations will be united in song, "Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!"
